Export Requirements for Antigua and Barbuda

AB-1 (Oct 13, 2006)

*Eligible/Ineligible Products**

A. Eligible Products

1. Red meat and poultry products.

Export Requirements for Barbados

BAR-11 (Aug 12, 2009)

Eligible/Ineligible Products

A. Eligible Products

1. All fresh, frozen or chilled beef and beef products (beef products includes offal, variety meats and processed beef) derived from cattle slaughtered on or after January 16, 2008.
2. Fresh/frozen beef and beef products imported from Australia may be exported to Barbados. (See documentation section requirements.)
3. Fresh/frozen and cooked poultry meat products.
4. Wild Boar.

Export Requirements for Cayman Islands

CAY-9 (Jan 9, 2007)

Eligible/Ineligible Products

A. Eligible Products

1. Fresh/frozen or chilled boneless and bone-in beef derived from cattle less than 30 months of age produced under an approved AMS Export Verification (EV) Less Than 30 (LT30) months of age program. Information about the program for the Cayman Islands and a list of LT30 approved establishments can be obtained from [AMS' Web site](#).

If FSIS inspection personnel become aware of concerns that an AMS approved LT30 establishment is not properly executing its Quality Control Program, export certification should not be issued for the product in question and AMS should be notified at ARCBranch@usda.gov. Inspection personnel should include their immediate supervisor on messages to AMS. The following information should be included in the message:

- Establishment name, address, and establishment number
- Product type, product code, and quantity of product
- Date of production, lot number, and shift
- Date and nature of observation
- Name of country product is intended for export

- Export certificate number (if applicable)
- Any other information to verify claim
- Name of inspection official

Veal and veal products are not subject to the LT30 program.

2. Ground beef meat, salted beef, processed foods containing ruminant meats including sausages, meatball patties, dried meats, hermetically sealed canned meats, and ready to eat meats manufactured in the United States after January 12, 2004. These products can come from animals of any age.
3. Bovine liver from animals of any age.
4. Sheep and goat meat and meat products from animals less than 12 months of age and produced under an AMS EV program.
5. Meat and meat products legally imported into the United States from Australia, New Zealand, or Canada. Establishments where non-conforming product is also present is subject to an approved AMS Export Verification (EV) program.
6. Canned, boneless meat legally imported into the United States.
7. Protein free tallow (containing a maximum level of 0.15 percent by weight of insoluble impurities).

B. Ineligible Products

1. Meat and meat products containing meat derived from an Advanced Meat Recovery (AMR) process.

Export Requirements for Dominica

DO-1 (Mar 16, 2009)

Eligible/Ineligible Products

A. Eligible Products

1. Meat and poultry and meat and poultry products produced in the U.S.
2. Meat and poultry and meat and poultry products imported from Australia, Canada, and New Zealand.*

B. Ineligible Products

1. Liquid beef blood products.*

Export Requirements for Guadeloupe

GD-0 (Jun 22, 2000)

Guadeloupe is not a member of the European Union; however, French requirements do apply to red meat and poultry exports. Refer to the [Export Requirements for France](#) or the [European Union](#) requirements. Contact FSIS Technical Service Center at (402) 344-5000 if further details are needed.*

Export Requirements for Martinique

MB-2 (Jun 22, 2000)

Export Requirements for Netherlands Antilles

NA-3 - (Feb 13, 1995)

Eligible Products

- A. Curacao Veterinary Services accepts red meat and red meat products from the United States.
- B. Bonaire accepts red meat and red meat products under the requirements presented in the "Guideline for the Production of Fresh Meat Intended for Export to the European Union" and [Netherlands requirements](#). Both documents can be found in the FSIS Export Library. Contact FSIS Technical Service Center for further information at (402) 344-5000.

Export Requirements for St. Kitts and Nevis

KIT-5 (Jun 16, 2009)

Eligible/Ineligible Products

- A. Beef and beef products. Effective for beef and beef products derived from cattle slaughtered on or after June 14, 2009, all age restrictions and product restrictions have been removed.

Export Requirements for St. Lucia

LU-15 (Jul 14, 2009)

Eligible/Ineligible Products

- A. Eligible Product
 - 1. Fresh/frozen poultry and poultry products, except as restricted in the "Ineligible Product" section below.
 - 2. Boneless beef and boneless beef products derived from cattle less than 30 months of age produced under an approved AMS Export Verification (EV) Less Than 30 (LT30) months of age program. Information about the program for St. Lucia and a list of LT30 approved establishments can be obtained from [AMS' Web site](#).

If FSIS inspection personnel become aware of concerns that an AMS approved LT30 establishment is not properly executing its Quality Control Program, export certification should not be issued for the product in question and AMS should be notified at ARCBranch@usda.gov. Inspection personnel should

include their immediate supervisor on messages to AMS. The following information should be include din the message:

- Establishment name, address, and establishment number.
- Product type, product code, and quantity of product.
- Date of production, lot number, and shift.
- Date and nature of observation.
- Name of country product is intended for export.
- Export certificate number (if applicable).
- Any other information to verify claim.
- Name of inspection official.

Veal and veal products are not subject to the LT30 program.

3. Fresh/frozen pork and pork products are eligible effective July 8, 2009.*

B. Ineligible Product

1. Poultry and poultry products raised, processed, or stored in states where low pathogenic or high pathogenic Avian Influenza has been reported.
2. Beef offal products.

Export Requirements for St. Vincent and the Grenadines

VC-3 (Sep 13, 2005)

Eligible/Ineligible Products

A. Eligible Products

1. Beef and beef products.*

Export Requirements for Trinidad/Tobago

TD-10 (Aug 15, 2008)

Eligible/Ineligible Products

A. Eligible

1. Poultry and poultry meat products.
 - a. Giblets cleaned and packed in carcasses or bulk packed are eligible.
2. Beef and beef products.

B. Ineligible

1. Poultry and poultry products from Arkansas, produced on or after May 30, 2008 and on or before June 21, 2008 are ineligible.*
